Owing to Chinese New Year there will be no distribution of work at the Town Hall on Friday the 4th inst., but work can be sent for to Mrs Ebden, Western Road, if desired. The next case will be packed on February 17th. The following letter has been received from Lady Dawson, acting Hon. Sec. Q M N.G. dated 5th January.

"The case sent off on 15th November, by the ss. Fushmi Maru has arrived safely, and the Queen desires me to convey Her most grateful thanks for all the very nice things that have been sent. They are well made, and most useful, and are all being packed up now to go to the hospitals at Alexandria and in France. The things are just what we want, and we are most grateful for them. With our renewed thanks, Believe me, Yours truly, Aimée Dawson."
