




Gunmen get away with \$160,000 worth of gems

KUALA LUMPUR, Tuesday

TELECOMS employee, who was wearing a jungle-green jacket, was shot dead today by one of three gunmen who probably mistook him to be a policeman waiting to trap them at a traffic lights junction here.

The gunmen and an accomplice armed with a knife, who had earlier grabbed about \$160,000 worth of jewellery from a gold-smiths' shop in Jalan Tuanku Abdul Rahman, were at that time making their get-away in a mini-bus which they had hijacked.

The dead man was identified as Mr Moha-mad Nash bin Moha-mad Ahari, 36, a dis-patch clerk with the Telecoms department.

One of the policemen fired three shots at the robbers but missed. The robbers fled into a more crowded area where the police could not fire.

The robbers jumped aboard a mini-bus, driven by Mr Looi Weng Soh, 35, which had stopped to let a passenger

Mr Looi was ordered at gunpoint to drive off. There were at least five other passengers in his bus at the time.

The policemen lost sight of the robbers but, alerted by the gunshot, they found Mr Mohamad Nash lying wound-ed on the road. They immediately rendered aid.

A passing motorist later rushed Mr Mohamad Nash to the General Hospital but he died

on the way.

Minutes after the shooting, city chief po-lice officer Datuk Zaman Khan and his CID chief Asst Commis-sioner Tuffile Nawab Din were informed that the robbers were seen near the wholesale mar-ket off Jalan Ipoh— about a kilometre away.

Datuk Zaman and his men rushed to the spot where they saw three men running away.

The policemen gave chase and Datuk Zaman fired a warning shot. The men kept on running.

Datuk Zaman said: "We could not fire at them because of the large crowd at the area. We would rather let the criminals escape than

shoot innocent people."

Police seized a knife
believed to have been thrown away by the robbers near the wholesale market.

Police also detained a suspected drug addict at the scene but said the man was not one of the robbers.
