

The Selangor Prison.

The Selangor Prison Report for 1891 mentions that, of the prisoners committed during the year, 138 had previous convictions; the greater part of these were vagrants, who do nothing but frequent the Gaol. The Superintendent of prisons there finds it a pity that these people cannot be deported, as they are an intolerable nuisance. The building of a New Gaol was commenced in the month of January on a site well adapted for the purpose, situated bn the Pudoh Road, about one mile from Kuala Lumpur. It is expected that this establishment will, when completed, afford accommodation for all the prisoners in the State. Temporary wards are being built for the prisoners in order that they may be removed at once and employed clearing the ground for permanent buildings.
